

Education Model

The Virtues Campus program blends online university courses with an on-campus experience. This unique style of learning gives students the freedom of a flexible study schedule while allowing them to enjoy an on-campus experience where they collaborate on academic projects with their peers, participate in careerreadiness activities, and study the Bible together.

While enrolled in college, students are encouraged to put their academic knowledge into practice immediately and build their professional experience by working a part- time job, participating in coaching, job shadowing, and engaging in volunteer activities. Our program design creates lifelong friendships, builds students' credentials, and establishes a professional community network that propels students toward their academic and career goals.

Blending the flexibility of online courses with the benefits of an on-campus experience.

Trained academic pastors are the heartbeat of our campuses, encouraging and equipping students to apply their studies in ways that integrate character, truth, and integrity.

On-Campus Community Biblical Worldview Affordable



Students enroll concurrently – taking online courses through a partner university or another college of their choice, while taking oncampus courses at the local Virtues Campus.

A cohort of up to 25 people meet on a local campus three days a week, three hours a day from September to May.

Applications are being taken for fall semester.

Two-year program (two consecutive semesters in each of two consecutive years).

Trained academic pastors provide oversight, coaching and mentoring.



Online Classes at Partner University

We are proud to be in partnership with universities/colleges across the country. These partnerships offer deep discounts for their online classes and will transfer Virtues Campus classes for up to 30 credits toward an AA degree over the 2 years.

Crown College in St. Bonifacius, MN. Crown offers two semesters a school year. Their cost for Dual-enrolled is \$83 per credit and Post-graduate is 50% off the OL credit price, approx. \$247.50 per credit.

Waldorf University in Forest City, Iowa, Waldorf offers four eight-week terms in a two semester time frame. The cost is \$216* per credit if enrolled at Virtues Campus concurrently. *This cost is a 32% discount on the online 2022 credit price. 4 courses or 12 Virtues credits transfer to Waldorf.

William Jessop University in Rocklin, CA. Jessop offers four seven week terms in a two semester time frame. Their cost is \$100 per credit if enrolled at Virtues Campus concurrently.

Calvary Chapel University in Sun City, AZ \$300 per course (\$100/cr) up to 10 courses (30 credits) They offer 8 week courses.

While students are enrolled in different online university courses that meet their specific college degree plans, students study these personal and professional development classes on-campus together at The Virtues Campus.

Career Readiness

Students study the biblical view of vocation and assess their own career options in light of understanding their unique God-purposed design. Service Learning Projects, coaching and career-focused job-shadowing provide students the opportunity to apply what is taught in a real- world setting.

Courses include: Vocation By Design, Career Calling, Service Learning, Servant Leadership, Personal Finance and Life Skills.

Bible

Two-year study offers students a comprehensive understanding of the Scriptures and the Truths revealed in God's Word.

Course include: Introduction to New Testament & Old Testament.

Truth in Action

Students study topics designed to foster a transformative understanding of biblical worldview and Christ-like character that can be applied across academic disciplines and all areas of life – personal, public and professional.

Courses include: Survey of Christian Apologetics, Survey of Competing Worldviews, Survey of Social Engagement, and American Government.

Affordable Education

At the core of The Virtues Campus is the belief that to be a steppingstone, education should be affordable.

Students may enroll in any online university they choose. The Virtues Campus has partnered with Crown College, Waldorf University, Calvary Chapel University, and William Jessop University. If students enroll in a partner university, they are then eligible to receive credits for Virtues classes and receive discounted credit costs at the partner university.

Students receive books for Virtues Campus classes at no additional cost. Books at the online classes may be an additional charge.

To obtain a two-year AA degree (60 total credits), our students will typically take 15 credits per year for two years at Virtues Campus and up to 30 credits over 2 years at the partner university.

Virtues Campus cost is \$5,000 per year (for 15 credits) paid to Virtues Campus. Partner university is a per credit cost for 15 credits per year for approx. \$1,800 per year paid to the partner university.

Virtues Campus tuition is payable: \$400 as a deposit, \$2,100 due 1st day of 1st semester, and \$2,500 due 1st day of 2nd semester. Contact Virtues Inc. if you need to make payments.

Admission Policy

A high school diploma or GED is required. Students with a GPA below 2.5 will be reviewed on an individual basis. We do not require ACT or SAT scores for admission, but your chosen university will.

Application Steps

Once accepted, complete the Enrollment Acceptance form on-line and submit a non-refundable deposit to guarantee your place in class.

Complete your enrollment with your chosen university. Acceptance to The Virtues Campus does not guarantee admission to a university.

Attend the student orientation session two weeks before school starts.

Pay tuition for the first semester before the 1st day of class.
